WHY: MORE AND BETTER ENGAGEMENT

RECOMMENDED PRACTICE 1185

NEW PROJECTS

- Issues or concerns that can stop a project can remain hidden from traditional route review or outreach strategies
- Effective engagement can overcome barriers to participation by stakeholders with serious concerns
- Brings to light the cumulative context of a community or location otherwise unseen by analysis of the project itself
- Costly delays to a project can be avoided if community concerns are uncovered and addressed promptly



EXISTING PIPELINES

- Communities and the burdens they face evolve over the long life of a pipeline
- Analysis of the immediate area around a pipeline right of way may not reveal the full range of social issues confronting operations
- Neutral or positive attitudes towards an existing pipeline may have changed over time and require attention
- More sensitive or probing questions from the public about operations and performance can benefit from a structured information sharing decision process

EQUITY & INCLUSION

- Provides for the purposeful efforts needed to connect with stakeholders that face barriers to participation
- Proactive engagement helps include communities underrepresented in the past
- Awareness of cumulative experiences will increase effectiveness of engagement
- Bring tailored resources to address disparities and differences in stakeholders to achieve meaningful participation, communication, and interaction



SCALABLE AND FLEXIBLE

Recommended Practice (RP) 1185 for Pipeline Public Engagement will help pipeline operators facilitate input from the public on proposed and existing pipelines. RP 1185 provides a scalable and flexible framework with implementation specifics dependent on the type, size and location of a pipeline and existing programs already in place.

TWO-WAY CONVERSATION

RP 1185 goes beyond traditional public awareness one-way information flows from a pipeline operator to the public. RP 1185 will help pipeline developers and operators proactively engage the public in two-way conversation, providing equity and inclusivity for input from a broader range of the public offering different perspectives and potential concerns.
